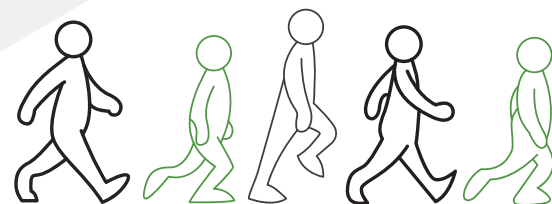

Mt. Lebanon is a safe place but our streets can be very busy. We continue to work to educate pedestrians, drivers and cyclists on ways to co-exist peacefully and safely on our avenues.

- In business districts, you must **cross at crosswalks** when you have the walk signal.
- If the countdown starts to flash do not start to cross the street.
- Do not cross if you have a solid orange hand.
- **Make eye contact with drivers** even if you have the right of way to ensure you are seen.
- **Check traffic in both directions**, even on a one-way street.
- **Pay special attention** during winter when hats and earmuffs block traffic sound.
- **Do not look down at your phone** while walking.
- **Always use the sidewalk.** If your street doesn't have one, walk on the left side of the road facing oncoming traffic.
- **Use only one earphone** at a time.
- If a driver has motioned you ahead, make sure there is no traffic in an adjacent lane.
- **Avoid alcohol and drugs** that alter your perception.
- Do not take a driver's signal for granted.
- **Always look both ways** before crossing, start and end by looking left.
- Wear bright colors.
- **Don't assume** anyone else can see you.
