



Mt. Lebanon is a safe place but our streets can be very busy. We continue to work to educate pedestrians, drivers and cyclists on ways to co-exist peacefully and safely on our avenues.

- In business districts, you must cross at crosswalks when you have the walk signal.
- If the countdown starts to flash do not start to cross the street.
- Do not cross if you have a solid orange hand.
- Make eye contact with drivers even if you have the right of way to ensure you are seen.
- Check traffic in both directions, even on a one-way street.
- Pay special attention during winter when hats and earmuffs block traffic sound.
- Do not look down at your phone while walking.
- Always use the sidewalk. If your street doesn't have one, walk on the left side of the road facing oncoming traffic.
- Use only one earphone at a time.
- If a driver has motioned you ahead, make sure there is no traffic in an adjacent lane.
- Avoid alcohol and drugs that alter your perception.
- Do not take a driver's signal for granted.
- Always look both ways before crossing, start and end by looking left.
- Wear bright colors.
- **Don't assume** anyone else can see you.
