Why Red Light Cameras in Abington?



- Placed at intersections where:
 - Crashes were the highest
 - High number of red light violations
 - PD unable to conduct traditional enforcement
- Technology allows us to conduct more efficient/safer enforcement

Abington Township Red Light Camera History



- Started with meetings with PennDOT and Sensys Gatso in 2013
- Education started in the Spring of 2014
 - Message Boards, warning signs
 - Social Media, Press, Meeting with community groups
- Warning Period started August 1, 2014
- Cameras went live October 1, 2014

Program costs from the beginning



- Abington Police Department's Personnel Costs for Implementation of Program and Administration Costs
 - Period Between 2013 to July 2014 (Leading up to the cameras)
 - Meetings with PennDOT and Sensys Gatso
 - Total Due to Abington Township is \$38,173.61 (Hours TSU spent attending meetings)
 - Paid by the end of 2014 with camera fines

- 2014- GATSO Reimbursed our Highway and Engineering Departments for Installation of Cameras, Poles, Signage, Maintenance and Right of Ways
 - September \$52,000.00 and November \$22,000.00
 - Approximately \$75,000 Paid to Abington Township

Cost of the program 2013-2025



- Total Reimbursed Administrative and Overhead costs since 2013:
 \$739,149
- Total Un-Reimbursed Administrative and Overhead costs since 2013:
 \$0.00
- All Abington Township Expenses have been paid through August 2025.

*No unexpected costs have occurred as a result of the Red Light Camera Program.

Contract History



- First Contract 1 year 2014-2015
 - Sunset Clause after 1 year, cameras could be removed.
- Two Year Contract 2015-2017
- Three Year Contract 2017-2020
- Five Year Contract 2020-2025

Staffing



The program staffing consists of 1 professional staff member and three (3) officers.

- Rachel Conroy (professional staff)
 - -Conducts the initial review, logs all viewed violations and sends reports to Officers
 - -Schedules hearings, public questions, assist with record keeping
- Officer Posey (Traffic Safety Unit)
- Oversees Red Light Program, completes all required reports, keeps stats, conducts reviews, attends hearings
- Officer Freed and Coughlin (Traffic Safety Unit)
 - Conduct reviews of red light violations, attends hearings

Documentation



- Cody reports to keep track of time, report every month
- Expense report done first 10 days of the next month and sent to finance for payment
- Most reviews, reports, stats, etc. are done on overtime, does not affect traffic safety's regular function
- Fixed hours for finance, highway, staff
- All time spent on the red light cameras are reimbursable
- All red light camera expenses are paid by fines

Review Process



- Rachel reviews violations for a day and sends the TSU a report
- One of the TSU Officers reviews the day and sends a report back
- Rachel and Officer log any changes on spreadsheet
- Rachel sends an end of the month report for PennDOT reports and APD reports
- Violations are viewed from a website, each violation takes a minute or so to review & officer approves or rejects the violation
- Sensys Gatso sends out all notices to vehicle owners
- Average 855 violations/month over last 12 months

Fines



- Red Light Camera fines are \$100
 - Violations are civil not criminal
 - No points
 - Not reported to insurance
- Payment options:
 - online
 - check or money order drop-off at APD
 - mailed to Sensys Gatso
- Twice a month, Sensys Gatso "sweeps" fines to an account set up by Abington Township Finance Department
- Abington Township is paid first for expenses to run the program
- Sensys Gatso is then paid their monthly fee

Education



- Signs are required by PennDOT at intersections
- We placed sign boards at different locations throughout the Township
- Used TV & social media to remind drivers of locations
- <u>Facebook Chat</u>: 10/19/17
- Placed posters and trifolds at library, hospitals, local courts, WGPM, food stores, college campuses and local business
- Met with local civic groups-important to explain the cameras are about safety not money. Continue meeting w/groups
- Ongoing use of social media to educate citizens about the cameras and their locations

Technology



- Police Departments are using technology more
- Montgomery Twp, Warrington Twp and Bensalem Twp all recently started red light camera programs with Sensys Gatso
- City of Philadelphia continues to expand their red light camera program, now use speed cameras on Roosevelt Blvd and will soon use them in approved school zones
- Cameras on school buses are being utilized in over 70 school districts in PA including Abington Twp.
- Rep Ed Neilson (Phila) plans on introducing legislation this summer to allow all municipalities in PA to have access to red light cameras.
- This technology is here to stay!

Crash Stats Before and after the Cameras

Rear End Crashes	134	104	-22 %	
Injury Crashes	59	39	-34 %	

Crashes continue to decrease at the red light camera intersections, down 13% over the last 6 years.




